A Brief for Creative Practitioner

School Details:

Black Lane Primary School is a small school set in the village of Pentre Broughton, Wrexham. We currently have 160 pupils on roll between the ages of 3-11 years, who are taught in mixed age classes.

The children are at the centre of everything that we do. Throughout the school we strive to provide children with a range of enjoyable learning experiences which bring the curriculum to life and make learning fun.

What we are looking for:

We are now in our second year of the Lead Creative School Scheme. We are looking to continue to implement and build on the new and innovative ways of teaching and learning to raise standards of learning by working collaboratively with creative practitioners. We aim to incorporate exciting, real life experiences into our curriculum that allow pupils to reach their full potential, whilst preparing them for lifelong learning.

We are looking for a creative practitioner who can collaborate with teachers and pupils to develop the use of the outdoors to develop storytelling skills in our school and answer our enquiry question:

Can the use of the outdoor learning environment raise standards of speaking and listening and develop storytelling skills?

We are aiming to engage and excite our children to develop a love for storytelling and the confidence to speak confidently to an audience! In order to do this, we would like to focus on using storytelling, drama and the use of the outdoor areas to create story worlds that the children can use to tell stories.

We would like children, staff and the artist to work collaboratively to explore the outdoor area to stimulate imagination and create story world areas that the children can use for storytelling. We want our learners to develop their imaginations, vocabulary and understanding of story structure in order to tell stories fluently and confidently.

We anticipate the project culminating in a celebration of the imagination, where children share their ideas, experiences and stories with other classes and parents.

The project will be working with a class of 30 year 1 and 2 pupils (ages of 5-7 years).

Who We Want:

We are looking for a creative practitioner who:

- ✓ Is excellent at storytelling and drama
- ✓ Can use the outdoors creatively to engage young children in retelling stories in a fun way
- ✓ Inspires others to work together collaboratively
- ✓ Has experience of working with children between the ages of 5-7 years

It is envisaged that the project will run from January to March 2019 for at least 1 day each week, where days and dates are negotiable. There are a total of 16 practitioner days available at a rate of £250 per day, which includes 1 planning day and 1 evaluation day.

The successful practitioner will take the lead role and will be required to feed into the outline planning for the project. There are 16 practitioner days in total, the lead artist may use some of these days to bring in an artist (e.g. musician, visual artist) from another discipline to explore the stories in a different way.

How to Apply:

If you are interested in applying for this exciting role, then please submit a CV with a covering letter outlining how you would approach this project and how your experience and qualities would make you a suitable candidate. Applicants may also wish to include references for recent work carried out.

Interviews will be held at our school on **Tuesday 26th September 2018**. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to lead a 10 minute story activity to the class of year 1 and 2 children, followed by an interview carried out by the teaching staff, creative agent and 3 pupils.

The successful candidate will need a current DBS check for working with children.

Creative Practitioner Training:

Successful applicants must be available to attend a training programme for two days on 21st and 22nd November or 23rd and 24th November 2018 in Venue Cymru, Llandudno. You will not be paid for attending this training. Practitioners who have already been trained need not attend.
