<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>This week let's remember our shapes.</p> <p>Can you name a circle, triangle and square when you are playing?</p> <p>When you are really good at that you could add rectangle. Have a shape hunt.</p> <p>What shapes can you see in your house or garden?</p> <p>What shape are your windows?</p> <p>You could play <a href="#">Shape Monsters</a> on your computer or tablet. (see link for Topmarks below)</p> <p>Can you name 3D shapes?</p> <p>In your house can you find a cube (square box), a cuboid (rectangle box) and a sphere (a ball)</p> <p>Which shapes are good for building with?</p> <p>Which shape will roll?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Story Time</u></p> <p>Can you choose a favourite story and tell it to a grown up using the pictures to help you?</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Physical</u></p> <p>Play musical shapes.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Cut out a circle, square, triangle and rectangle.</li><li>• Play some music and dance around the shapes.</li><li>• When the music stops sit on the closest shape.</li><li>• What shape are you sitting on?</li></ul> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Creative</u></p> <p>You could make a shape collage. Maybe you could make a picture out of shapes.</p> <p>You could print with shapes ~ dip empty boxes and tubes into a tray of paint and print a picture or pattern onto some paper.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Outdoors</u></p> <p>Collect some sticks and stones.</p> <p>What shapes can you make with them?</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Welsh</u></p> <p>Can you colour ~</p> <p>A circle in coch?</p> <p>A square in glas?</p> <p>A triangle in gwyrdd?</p> <p>A rectangle in melyn?</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>PSD</u></p> <p>Help to clear up the dishes and wipe the table. Can you sort out the cutlery into groups? Can you count how many forks you have?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Phonics</u></p> <p>Let's learn b.</p> <p>Can you bounce a ball and say b, b, b, b?</p> <p>Can you print or draw a b to decorate?</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><a href="#">See link below</a></p> <p>Maybe you would like to make your b into a buzzy bee or a butterfly.</p> <div data-bbox="1671 767 1872 914" data-label="Image"></div> <p>Find a bag and make a collection of things that begin with b.</p> <p>In my bag there is a bear, a ball, a book, some buttons and a banana.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><a href="#">Link to Jolly Phonics songs on resource sheet below</a></p>

<p><u>Language</u></p> <p>Write the letters of your child's name onto separate pieces of paper, card, stones etc.</p> <p>Hide them around the room or garden and then ask your child to find them all.</p> <p>Together, put the sounds into the correct order.</p>	<p><u>Creative</u></p> <p>Draw or print off your child's initial sound?</p> <p>They can decorate it any way they like.</p> <p>(See link to letter templates on resources sheet below)</p>	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p><u>Skittles</u></p> <p>Can you make some skittles out of some plastic bottles?</p> <p>Roll a ball or a toy car at them.</p> <p>How many did you knock down?</p>	<p><u>Outdoors</u></p> <p>Go for a walk. Can you spot something that is red, something that is blue, something that is green and something that is yellow?</p>
	<p><u>Physical</u></p> <p><u>Learn the rhyme and follow the instructions ~</u></p> <p>Can you stretch up very tall?</p> <p>Can you bend down very small?</p> <p>Can you jump out very wide?</p> <p>Can you rock from side to side?</p>		<p><u>Story Time</u></p> <p>Can you choose a favourite story?</p> <p>Sit and listen to a short story every day?</p>
