I have chosen to give a scale to my sister. I chose her because she is always kind to me and we play lots of games together.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Book nook</u></p> <p>Listen to the online story of the Rainbow fish. Can you tell a member of your family what the story is about</p> <p>https://www.readstoriesforkids.com/The-Rainbow-Fish.html</p> <p>Remember to keep reading on Oxford reading buddy.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Oracy task</u></p> <p>Reception- Can you learn the pirate ship song on the included cards, then mix up the cards and see if you can sing the song putting the cards in the right order again.</p> <p>Year one- learn the red racing car song looking at odd numbers. Can you then figure out the rest of the odd numbers to 20.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths focus</u></p> <p>Ordering numbers focus-</p> <p>Reception- order numbers from 1 to 20 you can use the sheet included or find a creative way to do this, some ideas are shown below. (you can always go higher than 20 if you can)</p> <p>Year ones- can you order numbers to 100 in tens, then to 20 in 2's. 50 in 5's. There is also a sheet ordering even numbers if you can do all of that.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Outdoor</u></p> <p>Some brilliant ideas for exploring the outdoors from the woodland trust-</p> <p>Such as a texture walk, bark and leaf rubbings</p> <p>https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/blog/2020/04/nature-activities-for-kids-to-do-at-home-part-4/</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Word Detective</u></p> <p>Reception- ck, ll focus Year ones- qu, ng focus</p> <p>(this is a guide children can focus on all sounds if they want to)</p> <p>Can you think of 5 words for each sound- then can you find some words which rhyme with them saying them out loud will help you hear if they rhyme.</p> <p>Eg- pull, hill, will</p> <p>Queen, quick, quiz</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Let's Investigate</u></p> <p><i>Keep using your own rain gauge to keep track of the weather and to measure how much rain we have had.</i></p> <p>Explore floating and sinking think about how we know if something floats and sinks.</p> <p>Choose some objects from your house and outdoor areas- make a guess about them- will they float or sink?</p> <p>Test them out and see if you were right-</p> <p>Look at the things which sank- why do you think this happened?</p> <p>What about the things which could float? Why might this have happened?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Design and make</u></p> <p>Design and make a small model linked to the sea using anything you have at home. You could use playdoh, lego, blocks, stones, sticks- its up to you!</p> <p>(eg- a submarine, pirate ship, underwater volcano, treasure chest)</p> <p>Then can you explain your model either by writing about it for me, sending me a video explaining it or explain it to a member of your family.</p> <p>Think about - what you have built, what you have used, why you chose to build that, what makes it special.</p>

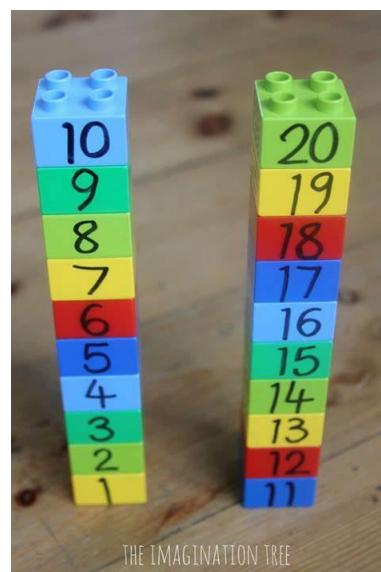
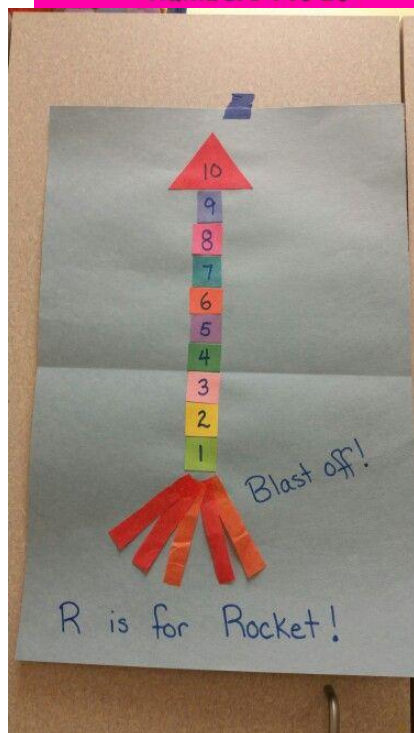
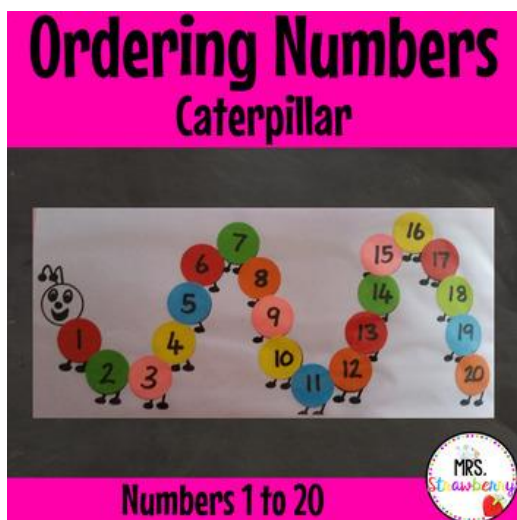
Maths focus -

Ordering numbers/ using odd and even numbers - possible skills to focus on are :

Reception skills	Year one skills
<ul style="list-style-type: none">compare and order numbers to at least 10.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">compare and order numbers to at least 20.recognise and understand odd and even numbers up to 20.

(If they find these tasks and numbers used easy they can always have a go at the Year one tasks, equally if the year one children are struggling start with the Reception tasks to recap and remind them and then move on.)
