Home Learning

Your child will bring home a story book each week. This is to share at home so that children can begin to enjoy listening to stories and begin to talk about the pictures and words. Ask questions about the story and encourage your child to retell parts of the story expressing what they like/dislike. Remember singing songs and nursery rhymes are an excellent way to engage children in language.

Topic Tasks: Teachers will provide a selection of practical home learning activities that link to the topic children are learning about in class. Parents and children can choose activities they want to complete and share any work with the class teacher. This will be celebrated in class.

Wrap Around Care

JigSaws provide wrap around care for Nursery children Monday - Friday; 11:30am - 3:00pm. There is a cost to this. Children will require a packed lunch or can order a school meal from the canteen. School dinners are currently £2.40* or £12.00* per week. Parents needs to pay for and pre-book school meals in advance - before 8:00am each day.
