ANNUAL GOVERNORS REPORT TO PARENTS BLACK LANE C.P. SCHOOL

This report follows the guidance offered in "The School Governors' Annual Reports (Wales) Regulations 2011"

Annual Parents Meeting

As a result of the School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013, which came into force on 4th May 2013, a school governing body is no longer required to hold an annual parents meeting.

The School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 now enables parents of registered pupils at the school to request up to three meetings per year with the governing body via a petition. A brief summary is provided below:

The governing body must hold a meeting within 25 school days of receiving the petition, providing that:

- 1. The petition contains the signatures of the required minimum number of parents of registered pupils at the school, which is:
 - (a) The parents of 10% of registered pupils,
- 2. The meeting requested by parents must be to discuss a matter relating to the school.
- 3. There will be no more than three meetings held during the year in which the first petition is received.
- 4. There are at least 25 school days left in the school year for the meeting to be held.

The meeting is open to all parents of registered pupils at the school, the headteacher and any other persons invited by the governing body. As soon as reasonably practicable, the governing body must notify all parents of registered pupils at the school in writing, the date of the meeting and the matter to be discussed.

Further detailed information is provided on the statutory requirement for these meetings, petitions and the process for holding the meetings can be found in Welsh Government guidance on Parents Meetings: statutory guidance to the governing bodies of maintained schools in Wales regarding the duty to hold meetings with parents.

Please note the Governors' Annual Report only includes information on the academic year from September 2022 to July 2023.

There were no parent's meetings that took place in 2022-2023.

Distribution

It is appreciated that producing and distributing the full annual report to parents can prove costly for schools. The Regulations therefore allow for schools to make available the full report only to those parents who request it, and to issue a summary report for distribution to all parents.

Eco Council and School Council

The School Council and Eco Council meet regularly to discuss ways to improve our school grounds and the environment. The children have visited the Mayor's Parlour and meet the Mayor of Wrexham.

The School Council work collaboratively with the PTA to plan fund raising and spending of funds.

The Eco Council have carried out an environmental review and have planned an Eco Day around areas for development. We achieved our 2nd Green Flag this year in recognition of the commitment towards sustainability and environment education. Our Eco Council (past and present) work very hard to communicate important messages about looking after our planet.

Attendance 2022-2023

At Black Lane we aim for every child to reach their full potential. Research shows that children achieve better if they are on time and have good attendance. In order to provide children with the best education, we aim for every child to achieve at least 95% attendance with the aim of achieving 100%.

As parents you can help your child by ensuring that they come to school on time and attend school unless there is a very good reason.

Attendance is monitored on a regular basis by the school and Educational Social Worker. We use a traffic light system to categorise attendance:

Green: 97% - 100% Amber: 93 – 96% Red: below 92%

We communicate attendance and the category at the end of every term.

This year we aim to further raise standards of attendance and achieve: 95.3%

The Governing Body aim to reduce the number of unauthorised absences:

- Encourage parents to contact school should the pupil be unable to attend.
- Encourage parents, on a regular basis to inform school of any changes to the home telephone number or contact address.
- To continue to personally contact parents / carers should pupils not arrive in school and no message has been received regarding pupil absence.
- Targets for the new school year will involve the reducing the number of pupils who are consistently late onto the premises.

Governors would like to remind parents that holidays, should **not** be taken during term time as it has a detrimental effect on the continuation of education.
